QUESTION ONE - COMPULSORY (30 MARKS)

- a) With clear examples in each case, differentiate between the following concepts as used in syntax: (12 marks)
 - i. Nominal clause and Adverbial clause.
 - ii. Trace and big PRO.
 - iii. Clause and sentence.
 - iv. Coordination and Subordination
- b) Construct simple sentences for each of the following clause patterns: (5 marks)
 - i. SVOC
 - ii. SVOOA
 - iii. ASVC
 - iv. SVOA
 - v. SVCA
- c) Rewrite the following question according to the instructions given in each: (8 marks)
 - i. Does Linet read poetry? (change into declarative sentence)
 - ii. Does Linet read poetry? (change into imperative sentence)
 - iii. Does Linet read poetry? (change into negative exclamation sentence)
 - iv. You come here quite often. (change into interrogative sentence)
- d) Explain the syntactic representations below and give a sentence in each case: (5 marks)
 - i. [S1 [S2] Coord [S3]]
 - ii. [S1 [subord S2, S3]]

Analyse the following sentences using tree diagrams:

- a) i. Koome upheld the election results.
 - ii. The tree toppled by the strong wind was ours.
 - iii. I know that the boy stolen the money.
 - iv. Drinking water every morning is healthy.
 - v. Students of Linguistics are very interesting.
- b) Giving appropriate illustrations, discuss the FIVE possible functions that phrases may fulfill in clauses. (10 marks)

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)

Provide a grammatical sentence with each of the following structural specifications:

- i. A verbless sentence.
- ii. A sentence with asyndetic coordination.
- iii. A sentence with an affirmative polarity item.
- iv. A sentence containing a non-defining relative clause.
- v. A sentence in exclamative form.
- vi. A pseudo-cleft sentence.
- vii. A sentence with a stranded preposition.
- viii. A sentence with a misplaced modifier.
- ix. A sentence with a that-clause as the object.
- x. A sentence beginning with an adverbial clause of time.

QUESTION FOUR (20 MARKS)

- a) Analyse the following clauses into phrases indicating the syntactic function (SVOAC) and (10 marks) syntactic category (NP, VP, AP) of each phrase:
 - The students are doing the Linguistics exam now.
 - ii. My friend has disappeared mysteriously.
 - iii. The lecturer sent the class representative his apologies.
 - iv. Suddenly, Brenda felt extremely happy.
 - v. I shut the door on seeing him.
- b) Briefly describe the FOUR types of sentences according to structure or clause type.
