b) Draw an Editorial Cartoon based on a topical issue covered in the same Daily (other than on the topic covered in (a) above). The cartoon should cover all elements required to make a complete and standard editorial cartoon of a daily newspaper. (8 marks)

c) In details, discuss five challenges of writing a weekly Column that targets the youth in Kenya. (8 marks)

- (a) Making reference to both four radio commentaries that are broadcast weekly, discuss five ethical principles that must be considered when writing such commentaries. (10 marks)
- (b) Evaluate five challenges that TV stations face in coming up with weekly commentaries.
